

All SPC members are welcome to be a part of the various committees that represent our church family. Experience is helpful, but not required so if you have a desire to be a member of one the committees please let us know!

Discipleship & Spiritual Formation

Purpose: To develop spiritual growth for all ages

Subcommittees: Children's Ministries (ages birth to 5th grade)

FriendShip Preschool Youth (6th - 12th grade) Adult Education

Examples of ways to serve in this committee:

- · assist with children or youth by:
 - teaching a class
 - · mission trip planning
 - assist/plan various activities
 - · provide food for activities
- · lead and/or teach adult education

Fellowship & Hospitality

Purpose: To host & plan for fellowship events

Examples of ways to serve in this committee:

 help to plan, organize & set-up church meals and/or receptions

Finance

Purpose: To oversee financial policies of the church

- accounting policies
- manage endowments and gifts
- investment strategies
- · prepare and review annual budgets
- · prepare long-range financial forecasts and plans

Membership

Purpose: To support the membership of SPC

- support the Volunteer Coordinator who helps assimilate new & current church members
- · support church staff with new member classes
- · oversee the Greeter Program and Muffin Ministry
- · update the church photo directory as needed
- · maintain and revise welcome brochure as needed

Subcommittee: History Committee

Examples of ways to serve in this committee:

- bake and/or deliver muffins to new members or to members who are ill or home bound
- · help to plan/organize new member receptions
- · assist Volunteer Coordinator with various tasks
- · have a passion for preserving the history of SPC
- · help recruit members to greet guests on Sundays



Mission

Purpose: To encourage mission activity at SPC

- · support our Pastors in seeking a deeper theological understanding of Mission within our congregation
- · seek ways to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to our church, community, and to the world
- · provide guidance for our church towards engaged participation in Mission activities
- · seek to develop mission partnership

Hammers and Nails: hands-on work projects for our church and for other area mission groups World Mission: supports and creates world mission opportunities

Examples of ways to serve in this committee:

- serve dinner at outside mission organizations once a month
- · work alongside kids to make healthy meals twice a month
- · take part in our annual rummage sale
- · work with developmentally challenged adults

- perform various tasks at our mission partner Center for Hope
- · paint, garden, build alongside Hammer & Nails at SPC
- · attend a mission trip
- · distribute food through the Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank
- · work on knitting projects with our Knitting Group

Personnel

Purpose: To provide support to our church staff

- · supports our Pastors to foster a climate of growth and development for all staff
- · provides a forum for all employees to communicate workplace misconduct
- · annually reviews the compensation and benefits for staff and recommends to the Finance Committee any changes to the Personnel budget
- periodically reviews the Employee Handbook and recommends changes to Session



Property

Purpose: To ensure the church's facilities and grounds are properly maintained and accessible to all

- uses church volunteers whenever possible for repair and maintenance
- sets and oversees independent contractor policy and building use policy
- evaluates equipment needs of church and oversees procurement and use
- · creates and implements a master facilities plan
- creates and maintains appropriate signage inside and outside our church
- maintains suitable interior decorating that is welcoming and comfortable

Stewardship

Purpose: To educate and communicate the mission and ministry needs of SPC

- · conducts an annual stewardship campaign
- provides year-round Christian stewardship education for the congregation
- · establish and maintain an ongoing Planned Giving program
- monitor all fundraising in the church to better understand our giving practices and history
- coordinate with the Finance Committee's annual budgeting process

Technology

Purpose: To maintain the church's information and communication systems

- operate, maintain, and train volunteers in the use of the SPC sound systems
- identify and develop various methods of communication with and among the congregation
- ensure the preservation of critical content via recording, streaming and archiving

Subcommittee: Sound Team

Examples of ways to serve in this committee:

- · operate sound equipment for services
- · provide IT assistance/guidance for church equipment



Worship & Music

Purpose: To support the music & worship of SPC

- · supports Pastors in planning worship
- supports Director of Music Ministries in oversight of:
 - church choirs
 - musicians
 - professional soloists
- · recruits, trains, and coordinates lay readers and ushers
- oversees sacraments, funerals, weddings, and the musical endowments

Subcommittees: Flower Funeral Wedding

Examples of ways to serve in this committee:

- · arrange flowers for Sunday morning services
- provide assistance at funeral services by handing out bulletins and greeting attendees
- · support wedding parties and clergy during ceremonies
- help to plan various aspects of worship services

Other ways to use your gifts with Worship & Music:

- \cdot sing in one of our choirs
- · play in our handbell choirs
- · be a lay reader during a worship service
- · usher on a Sunday morning
- help to serve communion
