
RUMBLE IN THE JUNGLE SUMMER CAMP



HOPING TOGETHER

For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Romans 8:24-25

From April 1-5, the PC(USA) and Evangelical Church of the Czech Brethren (ECCB) hosted a partnership conference at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. The conference is held every three years for congregations participating in the partnership and alternates between the US and the Czech Republic. Over 50 people attended from the PC(USA) and ECCB as well as ecumenical partners from the Lutheran Church and the Church of Scotland. Charlene Beck, Deborah Murdoch, Joan Murdoch, and Ann Strong attended from SPC, and Rev. Marek Zikmund, who visited SPC for several months with his family in 2007, represented our partner congregation in Přerov.

The conference provided opportunities to learn about the biblical and theological understandings of hope from seminarians representing Columbia Theological Seminary and the Protestant Theological Faculty in Prague. We also spent time in worship led by each of the congregational partnerships between PC(USA) and ECCB churches. During the worship led by SPC and Přerov, Marek played the guitar as we sang, We Shall Overcome. The following day, the 51st anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s assassination, we heard the song sung by community members and Dr. King's family during a wreath laying ceremony at the MLK Center.

After the conference, Marek and two representatives from the Diakonie of the ECCB, Lucie Slámová and Stepan Brodsky visited SPC. We enjoyed worshipping together, learning about their faith in the context of the history of the Czech Republic, and spending time together in fellowship. Marek participated in the local missions of SPC by helping to serve dinner at the Ladle. They also toured downtown Pittsburgh and cheered on the Penguins at the last game of the regular season.

We are encouraged by the faith and witness of our Czech partners and look forward to the opportunity to meet again.





SUPPORTING OUR JEWISH NEIGHBORS

In response to the horrific events at Tree of Life Synagogue in Squirrel Hill on October 27, 2018 and in support for our neighbors, the SPC Mission Committee approved donations to the local response efforts of the Holocaust Center of Pittsburgh and Jewish Family & Community Services (JFCS).

The Holocaust Center of Pittsburgh connects learning about the Holocaust history with the injustices of today. As stated in the Center's blogpost following the events

of October 27, "Each community member and organization plays a part, and ours is education... If one individual can shatter the hearts of an entire community, then surely one individual has the same capacity for good. The difference is made through the education they receive." Members of our congregation visited the Center's Butterfly Exhibit in preparation to the visit to Terezin, a Nazi concentration camp and

ghetto, during our 2018 mission trip to the Czech Republic. SPC members (pictured above) also visited the Stitching History from the Holocaust Exhibit which was a testament to the incalculable loss of the Holocaust through the story of Hedwig Strnad, a seamstress from Prague. Sadly, the recent anti-Semitic attacks in Pittsburgh bring an even greater sense of urgency to the Center's efforts to educate against all forms of hatred.

JFCS was one of the first organizations, alongside the Jewish Community Center of Pittsburgh and the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh, to provide resources for victims, their families and the community at large. JFCS facilitated training in trauma response to religious and lay leaders and continues to provide counseling for anyone

affected by the tragedy. Jordon Golin, CEO "Even now, months later, it's hardly possible to fathom such a violent act being perpetrated on Jews while they worship. While we are no strang-

ers to anti-Semitic behavior, this particular event that took place in our own community has shaken us all. But even in the midst of such intense darkness, we found light. That very day, waves of shared outrage, grief, sympathy and even hope began to pour in from all over the world."
